"LeBron James is the best basketball player of all time."

LeBron Raymone James Sr. was born on 30th December 1984 (Freedman, 1). He is sometimes referred to as "the King" due to the numerous professional achievements throughout his years as a basketball player. At the moment, he plays for the "Cleveland Cavaliers of the National Basketball Association" (NBA). As a result of his numerous achievements and awards, he has universally been proclaimed as "one of the greatest basketball players of all time." He has managed to win three NBA championships, four awards that are termed as the "NBA Most Valuable Player", three NBA Finals awards for MVP, two Olympic gold medals, the NBA scoring title, the award for NBA All-star Game MVP, the NBA rookie award and the award for Cavalier's all-time top scorer. After playing for the Claviers for a period of 7years, he opted out and moved to Miami Heat where he played for approximately four years. In this period, he was able to make the Heat reach the finals all four years in a row. After this last season, he opted out of the contract with the Heat and went back to

playing for Cavaliers, where he led them to three straight finals from 2015 to 2017. During 2016, he was able to steer them to a victory in the finals where this marked the end of their 52 years of not winning any professional title.

Looking closer at his professional basketball career, there are some aspects that tend to put him at another level when compared to other established and successful basketball players and hence giving him the title of the "Greatest basketball player of all time." To start with, he is "one of only two basketball players who has managed to average at least 25 points, six rebounds, and six assists during their career." When it comes to the actual numbers in the case of LeBron James, they are 27.1, 7.3 and 7.0. These are numbers which have only been matched by Oscar Robertson. Secondly, when it comes to his NBA MVPs, he has managed to accumulate at least four alongside other five players in the NBA who are: "Wilt Chamberlain (4), Bill Russell (5), Michael Jordan (5) and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (6)." Even though his titles are four, he is not done yet as he is striving to achieve more in his career as time goes by. Thirdly, when it comes to his determination to reaching the finals, he has managed to reach seven straight finals. This does not necessarily mean that he has managed to win all of the seven, but it showed how determined and accomplished he has been on wanting to play at the greatest stages of them all and with a large crowd. The only athlete who has tried to do the same is James Jones but he flunked out at the very end when he did not show up for the 2014 postseason, and thus LeBron remains the only player with such an achievement in their arsenal. The above stats are just numbers and accolades, but the real greatness and action come when LeBron James gets on the court.

During his games, he has been seen as the most versatile of all players that the NBA has been able to see. He is able to guard a total of all five positions with no hesitation; "he is able to play point guard and also a power forward on the same offensive possession." This to say the least is skills and greatness intertwined into one. Also, this shows that he has the wits

for the game in a way that very few of people within the NBA have. As such, "he has been termed as one of the smartest basketball players ever with an IQ that compares to only Magic Johnson in the modern era" (Hausman, Jerry, and Gregory, 586).
